Guided Reading in Room 25

During Guided Reading we have been focusing on using STARS Strategies (Strategies To Achieve Reading Success) like Making Predictions, Finding the Main Idea and Recalling Facts and Details to help us makes sense of the text we are reading. We have also been asking and answering levelled questions. There are 3 levels of questions:

Level 1 questions are explicitly stated in the text. We know that the answer to Level 1 questions are found in the book. The answers are 'right there'.

Level 2 questions require a little more thought, they are implied. We need to 'think and search' for the answer, by thinking about what we already know.

Level 3 questions ask us to give our opinion or think about the author's purpose for writing the text. We use our Question Window to help remind us about the different types of questions.

While one group reads and focuses on a targeted learning task the other groups work independently on other literacy activities. We love using our new whisper phones. We can read quietly and hear ourselves very clearly. This helps us to listen carefully to the sounds in the words and sentences we read. We also use them when practising our spelling words; we can hear ourselves break the words into syllables or sound each word out.

Another activity is to make our spelling words and from the sounds written on milk lids and write them in a list on our white boards. We have a challenge to see who can make a word with 4 or more letters that also has a digraph (2 letters that make one sound eg. wh, th, sh, ch, ck, ng)

Growth Mindset




Developing a bank of strategies.
