# Room 5

As school holidays are nearly upon us, the students in Room 5 can't believe they have nearly finished their first semester of full-time schooling. Time certainly flies when you are having fun!

In Social and Emotional Learning this term we have been focussing on all about the different emotions that we can feel. We have discovered that people can feel different emotions during the same situation.

During Week 7 we looked at the emotion of feeling scared. The students started off brainstorming situations that make them feel this way. We came up with a HUGE list of things that included; thunder during a storm, having a bad dream, watching a scary movie or being in the dark.

We then talked about the way it made us feel and the ways our body reacted to it. Did you know that feeling scared can sometimes make your body shake?

Lastly we looked at what we could do to make us feel safe again. This generated lots of exciting discussions and ideas.

Next week we will be learning about feeling grumpy. I wonder what we will discover?

# Room 40

This semester students at Makybe have embraced STEM learning. STEM learning (Science, Engineering, Technology and Mathematics) is a cross curricular approach to learning that teaches students the skills required to solve real-life problems. In Room 40 students have been working on making *Shoes for Refugees*.

In preparation for the making of shoes, students have been learning about the journey of refugees. We have read a range of texts, including Anh Do's *The Little Refugee* and had volunteer workers from a refugee camp in Greece come and talk to the students. We explored the journeys of refugees from countries such as Syria and made comparisons between their lives and our own.



Students have experimented with a range of materials including rubber, wood, plastic, foam and polystyrene, and tested how they react to friction, force, heat, and pressure. Students recorded their results in digital journals so they could select materials that would work as shoes in various conditions.

Students have designed shoes, worked collaboratively to modify their designs and next Monday will culminate their work to create shoes based on their designs.

# Student Leader Restorative Practices

As a School Leader I have completed lots of Restorative Practices and trials, so that we can help ourselves and others solving a problem.

Restorative Practice cards aim to help individuals share their concerns in a fair way. This makes everyone co operate freely without the feeling that others are going to put them down or ignore their thoughts.

The first stage of Restorative Practice is *'engagement to the conversation'* This is when everyone involved in the problem gets to share their side of the story, whilst taking other opinions into account.

Next leads *'the explanation'*. All parties explain, and reason, their decisions to everyone involved and affected.

Finally we finish off with *'expectation clarity'*. Everyone now understands the problem, the decisions, and what is expected of them in the future.

This process that we go through is called *'a fair process principle'*. We want our school to be safe, respectful, caring, inclusive and dynamic. This processes offers support to those affected by harmful action, whilst simultaneously those who inflicted the harm are held accountable for their actions and take responsibility.

This is why Makybe is a safe, cooperative environment with a supportive network within our school community

## Tip #8

Why are fractions important? Fractions are important because people use them every day in activities like cooking, carpentry, sports, sewing and many more areas. There are two key parts to a fraction - the numerator and the denominator.

The numerator is the number **above** the line of the fraction. It tells us how many pieces we have.

The denominator is the number **below** the line of the fraction. It tells us how many pieces there are altogether.

Here is a song you can use to help your remember the parts of a fraction...

**N**umerator is **n**ever **u**nder  
**D**enominator is '**d**' for **d**own


