## Message from the Principal

Dear Makybe Rise Families

We are incredibly fortunate here at Makybe Rise to have a strong community culture of care, kindness and cooperation.

I would also like to acknowledge our amazing staff who very professionally managed a tricky day. Our office staff were very highly organized, enabling parents wishing to pick up children due to smoke-induced asthma a quick and streamlined process. Thank you to all our parents who showed such respectful patience.

Our staff beautifully supported many students who experienced some impact from the smoke, however, I was concerned with the high number of asthmatic students who did not have an inhaler with them or did not know how to use a spacer. I would ask that all parents of students with asthma—even if the asthma only occurs occasionally—immediately ensure their child has an in-date inhaler and is familiarized with the use of a spacer.



## Biomes in Room 32

This term in Geography, the students of room 32 have been learning about the major biomes of the world. A biome is a large region that shares similar characteristics in regards to climate, flora and fauna. In groups we researched the marine, freshwater, rainforest, desert, grassland, tundra, taiga and deciduous forest biomes. The students have located these biomes on world maps and discussed the features of the biomes. They then went onto created 3D displays which give more information on the biome they were researching. Following on from this, the students will look in detail at the continents of Africa and Europe and compare and contrast their features to that of Australia. Did you know Antarctica is actually a desert??



## Subtraction Fun in Room 16!

In Room 16 we have been working on understanding subtraction sums. We started solving subtraction sums using concrete materials and reading number sentences. Now we have moved on to solving subtraction worded problems. We also started to use the AVID strategy, Marking the Text to help us decode what the question is actually asking us.

Here are some answers as to why we mark the text in maths, in particular worded problems.

-Because it helps us not get confused by the other words in the number story. – Jensen

-Because it helps you find the important parts of the questions. – Cody

-It helps you look for the numbers that actually make the number sentence. – Ben

Soon we will be creating our own subtraction number stories! I wonder what they will include?!

## Applying Mathematics to Real Life Situations - Room 38

In Room 38 we have been learning how to apply Mathematics to real life situations. In the learning area of measurement, we have learning how to measure things in kilometres, metres, centimetres and millimetres and how to convert between them. We had fun using the trundle wheels to measure various objects around the school. We then put our AVID skills into practice and used three column notes to identify the object we were measuring, how big it was in metres and then needed to convert that into centimetres. We know 10mm is 1cm, 100cm is 1m, 1000m is 1km. Look at us in action!

## Ridge View Secondary College


Dear Year 6 Families

- Cost – Approximately \$180 (total course fee for full 20 weeks)


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
