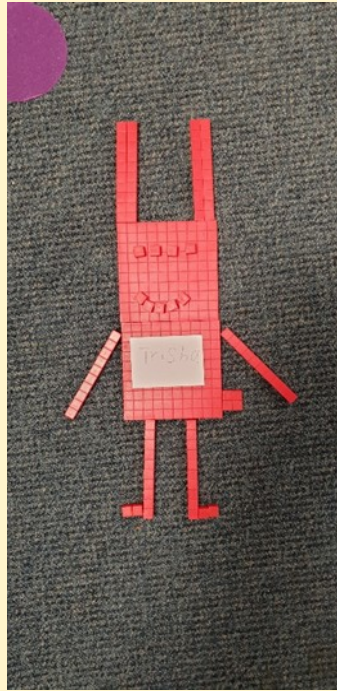
Place and Value in Room 27

In room 27 we have been focusing on place value and learning about the value of thousands, hundreds, tens and ones. Students used MAB blocks to make maths monsters. After making their monster they added up the total value of their monster then made comparisons with other students to find out which monster was worth the most and which was worth least.

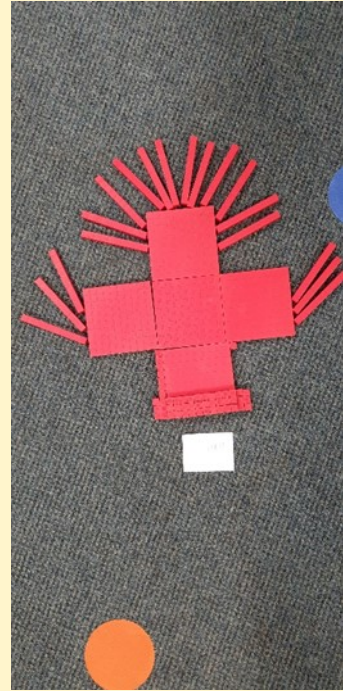
Monster total 646

Written Retells in Room 24

This term the Year Twos have been learning how to write a written retell. A written retell is when we retell the most important parts of a story from beginning to end in our own words! We might retell a story just for fun or to show how much we understood. When you retell a story, you can't retell everything, only the most important parts. These important parts include the characters, setting and the most important events from the beginning, middle and end. It's also important to include the problem and solution. Another important feature of a written retell is our own personal connection to the story. For example, we might ask ourselves; how did the story make me feel? How do I relate to a certain character? I remember a time when I felt like the main character.

A written retell also helps us to comprehend a text. We can use a variety of comprehension strategies to help us write a written retell including skimming and scanning, making predictions, finding the main idea and understanding the sequence of a text.

Father's Day Stall: 27, 28 & 29 August. Pre-paid event with purchasing via QKR from 29 July to 23 August (no late payments accepted).

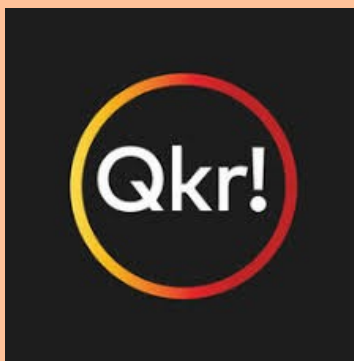
Disco: Friday 30 August. Pre-paid event only, further details to come.

Munich Airport has, for the 12th time in 14 years, been announced "Europe's Best Airport" in the World Airport Awards.

Munich Airport also scored second in on-time arrivals and departures worldwide, behind only Tokyo's Haneda and ahead of Brazil's Sao Paulo Guarulhos, in the category of large airports with over 20 million passengers a year. 87.71% of flights from and to Munich are not over 15 minutes late (Tokyo Haneda 91.25%).
