NAIDOC Week Celebrations

Last week the students of Makybe Rise Primary school celebrated NAIDOC Week. NAIDOC Week celebrates the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. During the week students participated in a variety of classroom activities to celebrate. Some of these activities included learning Noongar dreamtime stories, Noongar words, Aboriginal songs and student's even got to experience some traditional Aboriginal games in physical education lessons throughout the week.

On Tuesday the whole school participated in a sing along and watched the Madjitil Moorna choir sing Noongar songs. On Friday the whole school joined Room 26 and Room 27 in an assembly to celebrate NAIDOC week. Students performed a retelling of the dreaming story 'How the birds got their colours' and the whole school sang 'Wanjoo', a traditional Noongar welcome song.



Place Value in Room 25

We have been focusing on place value this term, learning about 2, 3 and 4 digit numbers. We know that the position of a digit is very important. A digit's value depends on its position in the number. We know that 2375 is made up of two thousands, three hundreds, seven tens and five ones. It was fun making our number monsters using MAB blocks. We designed the monster, then counted the total value of our monsters. We added the hundreds first then the tens and ones to get the total.



Finding the value of our names was also fun and interesting. Some of us found using capital letters easier because we could count by 10. Others liked adding the ones and tens together. We decided that it didn't matter if we used capitals or lower case letters, as long as we added the tens and ones accurately. We noticed that the number of letters in our names made the difference to the total value. We can show our total name value in blocks, words and sums.

Room 32 celebrates NAIDOC Week

Last week was NAIDOC week! NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee. It is held in the first full week of July. It is a time to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait islanders' history, culture and achievements and is an opportunity to recognise the contributions that the Indigenous Australians make to our country.

The theme for NAIDOC week this year is 'Our languages matter'. Originally there were at least 250 languages spoken, now there are only around 120. Room 32 learnt how to say some words in Noongar. One word is Kaya meaning hello.



We also learnt that the Noongar believe that the Waugal (rainbow serpent) dominates the earth, the sky and makes the Koondarnangor (thunder), Babanginy (lightning) and Boroong (rain) during the Nyitting (ancestral times). It created the fresh waterways such as the Bilyal Beelieer (rivers), Pinjar (swamps) and Ngamma (waterholes). The Waugal is a snake or a rainbow serpent recognised by Noongar as the giver of life. The aboriginal language was an oral one only being written down recently.


