

Literacy and Numeracy Week


Literacy and Numeracy Week was a huge success at Makybe Rise. On Monday, students started out by learning how to embrace a Growth Mathematical Mindset. This would help them tackle all the tricky tasks that were lined up for the week. This included learning new vocabulary, solving RUCSAC word problems and engaging in an open ended triangle task. Have you seen the classroom quilts around the school? Students had to use four triangles to make as many different shapes as they could and choose their favourite to contribute to the class quilt.

Students in Years 1 - 6 also engaged in two sessions of Flexible Maths Grouping. Flexible Maths Grouping is grouping based on needed skill, rather than overall mathematic ability. Several year levels used one of their sessions to focus on Time. Learning outcomes ranged from telling the time to the nearest hour (o'clock), to calculating elapsed time, to solving problems involving international time zones. Being able to tell the time on an analogue or digital clock is a very important life skill and a necessary building block for being able to calculate elapsed time or reading a timetable. We're hoping that Flexible Maths Grouping is an initiative that we can continue to develop and grow across the school.



Reading Club

At Makybe Rise we want to inspire students to have a life long love of reading. One way that we are promoting a love of reading is through the lunchtime Reading Club. On Tuesdays and Wednesdays, Miss McMahon and Mrs Christmass are spending time reading with a select group of students in Room 42. There are lots of Year 6 helpers who have volunteered to spend their time reading with younger students and helping run the club.



Makybe Maths Tip #1

This fortnight's focus is **Rounding**.

Why is rounding important? Rounding is a handy tool in the real world for working with amounts. It's a lot easier to work with values when they have been rounded to the nearest ten, hundred or whatever.

Here's a poem you can learn to help you with rounding...

4 or less, let it rest

Mathematical Mindsets: Logical Reasoning



You may ask, 'what is the point of my child explaining their work if they can get the answer right?'

Well as Jo Boaler (Mathematical Mindsets, 2016, p.27) states 'explaining your work is what we call reasoning, and reasoning is central to the discipline of mathematics'. Scientists prove or disprove theories by producing more cases that do or do not work, but mathematicians prove theories through mathematical reasoning. They need to produce arguments that convince other mathematicians by carefully reasoning their way from one idea to another, using logical connection.

So the next time your child does not get the correct right answer, talk to them and ask 'How did you do it?' or 'What is it that you don't understand?'
