



School Photo Day is Coming!



Our school photo day is coming in Week 4, Term 4!

This week every student will receive a Kapture Photography order envelope to bring home. The recommended method of ordering your photos is online through Kapture's website as your payment is secure and can be easily verified at any time. If you pay online, there is no need to return the order envelope to school.

Alternatively you can pay by cash and return the provided envelope to the school on the photography day. Please note the photographers cannot open sealed envelopes and cannot provide change.

SIBLING ORDERS CAN ONLY BE PLACED ONLINE: Late requests cannot be granted.

You have the option to order a sibling photo package online, however please note sibling orders will close at midday sharp on Friday 26th October. We suggest you place your online sibling order as soon as you receive your order envelope with your order instructions.

Log on to kapture.com.au for your sibling photo order cut-off date and time.

Late payment envelopes cannot be accepted by the school office or by Kapture. You can place an order online for class or individual photographs at any time for the remainder of the current school year however a \$15 fee will apply if you order more than 10 days after photography.

If your child is in a sports or special group photo, you can use the same school code on your order envelope to view and order these photos on Kapture's website, around the time that school photos are ready to be *delivered*. Please note; Class group, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online.

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please direct them to the Kapture office on 9240 1714 or email enquiries@kapture.com.au.

All students will be photographed individually on photo day for school administration records AS WELL as included in their class group photo available for purchase to all families. Should there be any reason why your child should **NOT** be included in the photo shoot –please contact the school office.

Makybe HaSS Update

On Wednesday August 29 the Year 4 classes went on an excursion to Fremantle. While there we visited the Shipwreck Gallery, ventured onto the replica of the Duyfken and went on a walk to take in some of Fremantle's rich history.

While in the Shipwreck Gallery we were enthralled to see treasures and remains of many unfortunate ships that were wrecked off the Western Australian coast. We wondered how many coins were on display and what we might do if we came into fortune! It was interesting to see how maps of Australia developed over time as more of our coastline was discovered. The original timbers from the *Batavia* (wrecked in 1629) formed an eye-catching display and gave us a real appreciation of the workmanship involved in ship building.

The weather was not kind to us and as a result some of us got to catch a glimpse of what life on the rough seas might be like when we ventured onto the Duyfken replica. In 1606 the original Duyfken, captained by Willem Janszoon, went on a search for "south and east lands". Leaving from Banda (Indonesia), *Duyfken* reached the Cape York Peninsula and charted 300km of the coast. This is the first historically recorded voyage to Australia. While on board the replica, we learnt of how bricks were used to weigh the ship down and heard many stories of what life for a sailor was like. Most of us were not impressed to learn that a rope was used in place of toilet roll!!

We walked to The Whaler's Tunnel that sits underneath the Round House. The Round House is WA's oldest building and was constructed by convicts as a gaol. The tunnel was constructed to allow whalers access to the town from the jetty.

Even though it was a cold and wet day we learnt loads and thoroughly enjoyed our short visit to Fremantle.


Growth Mindset

Crunch and Sip



Crunch & Sip is a set break to eat fresh fruit or salad vegetables and drink water in the classroom. Students re-fuel with fresh fruit or vegetables during the morning or afternoon, assisting physical and mental performance and concentration in the classroom. This gives kids a chance to refuel, a bit like putting petrol in a car.

Each day students bring fresh fruit or salad vegetables to school to eat in the classroom at a set time. Each child has a small clear bottle of water in the classroom to drink throughout the day to prevent dehydration.

Through Crunch & Sip, schools demonstrate their commitment to nutrition education in the classroom, by making links with the curriculum and creating a supportive school environment.

Summary of School Board Minutes: 11 September 2018

Physical Education Presentation:

- We are so grateful to our school community during the Coles Sports for schools initiative. 75000 tickets collected by our families and staff which has equated to \$3000-\$4000 worth of equipment for our sports department.
- Connect pages are regularly used as a communication tool to highlight student success with school activities.
- Our Physical Education department works closely with Baldivis Secondary College; we currently have 3 workplace students from Baldivis Secondary College assisting in different capacities.
- Our Physical Education Department will continue to promote local sporting clubs, these will be posted on connect.

Defense Services Transition Presentation:

- Sarah Eaton explained how she supports students of Defence families at Makybe Rise including parental absences and moving from school to school
- Sarah helps families to connect with Defence Service Transition Aides in other schools so students have a link when they move. Also supports families to connect with external services as required

Student Services Presentation:

- The Student Services team work closely with students requiring assistance with supplementary learning.
- The goals of Makybe Rise Student Services team is to develop planning and build professional expertise ,so that every child can be successful
- We currently have an onsite Psychologist and Chaplain to support our students and their families.
- Makybe Rise currently run 4 main intervention programs: Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Numeracy and Literacy Intervention


