# Hass in Pre Primary

This semester in Pre-Primary we have been learning about geography. We learnt that there are many more words that can mean subtraction. In a number sentence the words minus, take away, subtract, less, knocked down and ate all mean the same thing.

It all began over thirty years ago when a psychologist became interested in what makes certain people more successful than others. Professor Psychology Dr Carol Dweck has now become synonymous with the term mindset. After researching the power of our mindsets and the effect of praise, she has defined two ways of thinking; Growth Mindset and Fixed Mindset.

# Year 3 Spelling

Every week in Year 3 we use flexible groupings to run Spelling Master Classes. Students go to the classroom which is focusing on the area of spelling they are learning. The amazing group who come to Room 39 have been researching prefixes. Prefixes are at the front of a word and can change its meaning.

Some words have a base word. For example:

Word	Base Word	Prefix	Meaning
pretest	test	pre	A test before learning a new concept to assess what is already known.

We questioned why some words don't have a 'base word'. We are researching the origin of these words and where they have come from.

Yesterday we looked up the word 'prepare'.

## ICT in Room 40

This term in Room 40 we have been showing off our ICT abilities as we demonstrate our reading comprehension and summarising skills. Students have been using their Lexile home readers as a platform for developing a range of skills. Students independently read their targeted reading book, and use their Book Creator iPad Apps to import an image of their cover page, summarise, retell, type the story in their own words, then format their font to fit the desired space. Once completed, students are then required to screen capture, crop and air drop their final piece of work. They are fast becoming ICT whizzes!! Check out some of our amazing work samples!

This term we are very excited to be celebrating NAIDOC Week, which is held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

NAIDOC Week 2019 will be held nationally from Sunday 7 July and continue through to Sunday 14 July. As this is during our school holidays we will be celebrating NAIDOC Week in Week 10, from Monday 1 to Friday 5 July. The theme of NAIDOC Week in 2019 is **"Voice. Treaty. Truth. Let's work together."**, which is about acknowledging of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people's voice and truth. Indigenous people would like to see an increase in the decision-making in Australia's democracy and develop a treaty to formally acknowledge Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. This is closely linked to the National Reconciliation Week theme, "Grounded in truth: Walk together with courage" which we acknowledged earlier in June.

NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. The week is a great opportunity to participate in a range of activities and to support your local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community.


There are lots of events happening at Makybe and in our local community to celebrate NAIDOC Week.




*The Baldivis Film Academy is your start to a possible career in the exciting world of film making. Digital film is an important part of our culture and provides us with entertainment and information.*


